Module Aims أهداف المادة الدراسية	Identify the concept of crime and its elements, identify international and local laws that criminalize the acts committed by the Baath regime in Iraq, identify the most prominent cases and crimes considered by the Supreme Iraqi Criminal Tribunal and the size of those crimes, identify the psychological and social effects that affected the personality of the citizen and the resulting scientific and cultural impoverishment, and identify the environmental effects and what resulted in a decline in public health after the remnants of war and the drying of the marshes, Identify the mass graves left behind by the Baath regime and determine the location of each headquarters and the time of their occurrence.

- Understanding the definition of crime, its definitions in other sciences, and its classifications.
- Identifying the most prominent cases dealt with by the Supreme Criminal Court, the sentences issued against the convicted, and the laws under which death sentences were issued against Ba'ath regime figures.

- Remembering the most prominent religious figures who were persecuted and arrested due to their stance and opposition to the Ba'ath regime.
- Recognizing the most prominent political violations and raising awareness among community members about the Ba'ath regime's violations and their impact on Iraqi society.
- Highlighting the secret prisons and private detention centers where opponents of the Ba'ath regime were incarcerated.
- Stating the most prominent environmental violations committed by the Ba'ath regime in Iraq.
- Explaining and describing the most prominent areas of radioactive contamination and how the regime used scorched earth policies against villages and cities.
- Explaining how the marshlands in southern Iraq were drained and orchards and palm trees were destroyed after the 1991 uprising.
- Stating the mass graves committed by the Ba'ath regime.
- Explaining and describing the events of 1963 and the accompanying killings against Abdul Karim Qasim's regime and their relation to mass graves.
- Classifying the mass graves during the Iran-Iraq war and the associated events of the Al-Anfal massacre in 1987-1988.
- Recognizing the documents of the 1991 uprising and the mass graves committed by the Ba'ath regime after it was crushed, targeting its participants.
- Explaining the mass graves according to their occurrence from 1963 to the period when the regime fell in 2003, including the Barzani Kurds mass grave of 1983, the Al-Anfal massacre graves of 1987-1988, and the victims of the 1991 uprising.
